Local History Day

On Thursday 12th October we once again held our annual local history day with each year group having a clear focus of study so that by the time they leave Hanley St Luke's in Year 6 they will have learned about:



Sir Stanley Matthews Reginald Mitchell and the Spitfire Mining Heritage The History of our School The Pottery Industry The Birth of the Canals and James Brindley



It was a great day with Y6 visiting the canal, Y2 the Potteries museum, Y5 had a local artist in for a clay workshop and the other years got to handle many interesting artefacts and learn lots of amazing facts and also wow their teachers with how much they had remembered form previous years Well done children and thank you to Miss Hirst for organising.

Year 3: Unearthing the Story of Coal Mines in Stoke-on-Trent

In year 3, the focus shifted to the coal mining industry, which played a crucial role in Stoke-on-Trent's history. The children examined the working conditions of miners, including children who were often employed in dangerous and challenging roles. By studying the importance of coal mines, the children gained a new-found appreciation for the sacrifices made by miners and developed empathy for those who toiled underground to fuel the region's industrial revolution.





Year 2: Exploring the Work of Reginald Mitchell

Year 2 delved into the significance of the life and work of Reginald Mitchell, the brilliant designer of the iconic Spitfire aircraft. The children discovered how Mitchell's innovative engineering skills contributed to the success of this legendary fighter plane, which played a pivotal role in World War II. By studying Mitchell's achievements, the children gained a deeper understanding of the impact that individuals can have on history and the world around them.

Year 4: Tracing the History of Hanley St. Luke's School

Year 4 embarked on a journey to uncover the rich history of our own school, Hanley St. Luke's.



They explored a variety of artefacts from the 19th and 20th centuries, including attendance registers and log books of former head teachers. This exploration allowed the children to reflect on how school life has evolved since the school's establishment. As a culmination of their learning, the children created a time capsule, preserving a snapshot of school life in 2023 for future generations to discover.



Parent Maths Workshops

Year 1 and Year 2 parents were invited to attend another Mastering Number Parent Workshop this term. It was fantastic to see so many people attending to find out more about maths at our school!

After the success of these sessions last year, we moved them forward to Autumn term so that parents could gain an early awareness of maths in their child's current year group to support their child with maths at home and understand a little more about the kind of maths we do in class and the equipment we use. Children and adults played the fun maths games before taking home the first week of the five week homework project. Children in the past who have taken part in this have made almost 2 terms of additional

progress so we eagerly await to see the work produced this time!

There will be another Maths Parent meeting on Wednesday 15th November for Reception.



Uniform & PE

We've really started the year looking smart but just a reminder that if your child is wearing trainers on a non -PE day then they need to be ALL BLACK.
